

o not only look out

for your own interests, but also for the interests of others. Have in yourself the same attitude that Jesus had: although He always existed as God, He did not regard His divine status a thing to be grasped. He emptied Himself, taking on the form of a servant — the appearance of a man. And He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to His call, to death on a cross. (Philippians 2:4-8)

To those who have decided to follow Him, Jesus said, "When you do what I've told you to do, say, 'We are now servants, we have done what we ought to have done."

There is no doubt: the task and goal of the people who desire a relationship with God is clear, yet we so often fail.

We came together in September, when the weather was just beginning to move away from Summer. Most of us came to learn more about how to succeed in the fields we've chosen for our future. This is expected at a college. NNC, however, is not a typical college. We're here as students, of course, but also because of one of the things that makes NNC distinctive: This is a Christian college.

We're here to become educated. We're here, also, to live in the love of God, and express His love through our lives. As we move toward fulfilling our Major requirements, getting in enough credits, and pushing toward graduation, we are at the same time given a more compelling area of work to fulfill — to make our lives fully what God dreams for us to be.

We are —

Servants in the Making.
These four words comprise the concept of life at NNC. The officers of ASNNC have decided to dedicate their lives to this idea, and they have determined that it should be the theme of our school.

Through the ideas contained in these words, each student at NNC has been encouraged to live as fully as possible according to God's dream. Academic programs, special activities, community involvement and faculty members are all eligible to be — and must be — Servants in the Making.

Jesus knows us so well. Because of this or despite it. He also loves us so much. He realizes our frailty, or inability to be perfect every moment in the mornings as we walk to class by memory rather than consciousness; during classes, tests, and working on our papers; doing what resembles eating in SAGA; doing (or pretending to do) homework, and getting to bed at the decent hour of somewhere about dawn during finals. No one ever said (or no one sane, anyway) that being a reallife college student would be problem-free.


But Jesus knows our potential — more than we do ourselves. He knows, even when we can't imagine it, that as long as we live, each moment holds the promise of drawing us closer to the place of honor in God's consideration: The place of being a Servant. There's no room for pretending to become a servant, or for trying to serve a system of values. God's intentions are for us to serve Him and everyone else who you come in contact with.

God has not merely issued the command: "Go away and obey!" He never wanted that. He has given us the opportunity of education in a Christian setting so we can "Come together and obey." The example of Jesus' life ensures us that we can really be Servants in the Making — even when you went to Felter Lecture Hall the day Research and Report Writing is meeting in the library.











Jesus' life compels us to have the same attitude that He did: although He was in heaven — as God — He did not need to grasp on to His identity and try to prove what He really was. He gave Himself for one clear reason: to be a servant. Think about it! Jesus was a servant. We are greatly honored to be pursuing the same lifestyle as His — we are Servants in the Making.

We were able to exhibit this attitude in many ways this year. Opportunities come to us frequently, and our response is the key: What we feel and what we do for others proves that we are dedicated to servanthood.

We called a "truce" with the College of Idaho, and together raised money to help the Northwest Medical Teams in their service to famine-stricken Ethiopia.

We "adopted" the Lawson family in their moment of desperate need.

It is virtually impossible to come up with a list of the "ways" to become a servant. It would be easy if sitting quietly in chapel, passing Bib. Lit. 101, and going to Time Out on Wednesday nights were all that we had to do (or would it?). But really, there is nothing we can do. We must decide that we are going to be servants, not do acts of service. The "doing" is important, but without the "being", you won't have really had anything to do with fulfilling God's desire for your life - becoming a servant. There never can be any "formula" for the fulfillment of this way of living except following in the path of Jesus' life.

The love of NNC was given to them freely as students helped fix their car, pay their utility bills, care for their children, supply them with muchneeded money, and lift their spirits from deep sorrow.

We donated cash and canned foods so families who utilize the food banks in Nampa could be supplied and so families could be fed.

Without the people at NNC, many others — in the community and on the campus — would have felt the sting of pain as they fought — alone — through their problems. Those who are Servants in the Making helped to make life once again fulfilling for so many who needed help the most.




longer only a servant: you will be my *friend.*" For our lives as servants, Jesus gives us His friendship!


The promise has been given to us that the life of servanthood provides friends — those with whom we've been able to share our lives, and those who will really be our friends for the rest of our lives.

Faces and expressions of students make the campus a unique experience.












God reveals Himself throughout the changing seasons at NNC. He is always here, hoping we will realize the extent of His love, and reminding us of the greatness that comes from service.

new life to the people who call on Him to receive the love He so abundantly extends. The lengthening days of summer display the eternal life that God longs to provide each person. Even the end of the school year can produce an image of God: He assures us that the present world will not last forever and be our only hope, but that there is a rest to come - which we can be excited to someday participate in. NNC has something going on almost all the time. Under all circumstances you can see evidence of Jesus' love if you will look for it: All that is most valuable in life must be sought for, and so it is with Jesus - if we look for Him at NNC and anywhere else, anytime at all, we will see Him.

Responding to His love and deciding to be what He wants will make you a Servant in the Making. To live for Him means to be His servant. He helps His servants become His friends.






The antidote for three meals-a-day in SAGA.




Guest Speakers




Irrigating






Married Students







No Money

- 3. Therefore, those who have money cannot be students.



This is a time when visitors of the "opposite gender are allowed to be in your dorm room. Open Hous traditionally coincides with a rare occurance: Rooi Cleaning.






Picnies

This question is usually best answered when you read your diploma. You majored in Artus Baccalaurius.


