


Stone Hall is the headquarters and home for the missionaries. The building contains eighteen rooms,

inside. There is a back and front veranda. Grass and tile compose the roof.




Pentecostal Mission, Buldana, Berar, India.

Rev. Martyn D. Wood.

Rev. M. D. Wood is the honored superintendent of the Pentecostal Mission, Buldana, Berar, India. Brother Wood was born in Attleboro, Mass., Aug. 14, 1867. Converted while a student at Mr. Moody's school, June 17, 1886; sanctified at Douglas Camp Meeting; called to India in 1887, while listening to an address by Miss

Nettie Ballou (now Mrs. Crocker), a returned missionary. Sailed for India in 1892; returned after four years; sailed the second time in December, 1897; returned in 1903, and left for India the third time, May 7, 1904. Brother Wood has travelled extensively in India and is well acquainted with the character and needs of the people.



Anna Matlack Wood.

Mrs. Anna Matlack Wood was born in Sugartown, Pa., February 5, 1871. She was converted at a cottage meeting, February 11, 1889, and sanctified at the annual meeting, Lynn, Mass., April 14, 1897. While learning a poem entitled, "The Heathen Woman's Story," in 1890, she received a definite call as

a missionary She graduated as muse fr. in the Chester County Hospital, in Pennsylvania, in 1896. She has spent five and one-half years in medical work in India, treating in that period 12,000 patients. She speaks Marathi well, and has been used of God in the salvation of souls at home and abroad.

Miss Lillian M. Sprague was twice born, first in 1866 and second in 1877. The second birth brought light and victory which was never lost but greatly intensified by sanctification in 1892 when she was called to India. She sailed in 1897. Miss Sprague graduated from both courses of the Normal school at Randolph, Vt., after which she entered the Methodist Seminary.

Montpelier, Vt. As a pioneer missionary she used every means to make the work prosper. Many months were spent in travelling through the principal cities of India collecting funds for the orphanage buildings. Souls were led to Jesus along the way as also among the Marathi people, in which language she teaches.



John Wesley Wood.

John Wesley Wood was born in India about twenty-one years ago. He grew up in the midst of heathen idolatry. In the famine of 1897 he was driven from home to die by his elder brother. His smaller brother starved to death in the same famine. He came to the Pentecostal Mission in February, 1898, and was converted in the fall of the same year. Three times he has narrowly es-

caped death, once by famine; once by having his head cut open with an axe by robbers; once by being bled nearly to death by his mother, who offered his blood to her idols. He came to America with the missionary party in June, 1903, and was sanctified at Douglas Camp Meeting in July. John is a faithful young man and has been a valuable helper in the mission.

Brother James M. Davidson was born on a farm near Mahaffey, Pa., May 15, 1854. He was converted in the Mahaffey M. P. Church in the winter of 1884, and sanctified in the fall of 1894 in the same church, of which he was then a member. Two years ago, God called him to India. Last February, when Brother Wood and helpers were holding meetings in Mahaffey he said yes to the call. A favorite passage of scripture is Philippians 4: 13.

Mrs. Jennie M. Davidson was born March 2, 1871, in Big Run, Jefferson County, Pa. Her father died when she was less than six years old. She supported herself among strangers from the time she was about eight years of age until she was married in 1890. She was converted when seventeen years old. Since that time she has had a strong desire to tell the heathen what joy came into her heart through faith in Christ. In 1894 she was sanctified.



Julia R. Gibson.

Miss Julia R. Gibson was born on the island of Bermuda, in 1877. She was converted at Saratega, N. Y., Sept. 18, 1805, and sanctified in Grace Pentecostal Church, the same place, on March 20, 1901, Five years ago, through a missionary tract, read by her pastor in prayer meeting, her soul was crushed with the responsibility of the call and the sacrifice to be made. For more than a year she endeavored to say Yes. never succeeding in satisfying her Saviour until she was baptised with the Holy Ghost. Then the cross had wondrous glory. Remans 8 37 is a favorite verse.

Miss Priscilla Hitchins was born in Dimick, Ill., and was converted at the age of twelve. In 1806 all doubts were removed by a direc: witness of the Spirit. Right after the witness to her justification she began seeking the blessing of entire holiness. A short time after she stepped out by faith upon the promise the direct witness came, saying, "Now are ye clean." She said yes to India in her consecration, and would now rather go to India with Jesus, than to accept the highest position woman can occupy. Phil. 4: 19.

Mrs. Ella Winslow Perry was born June 20, 1856. At eleven years of age she experienced the peace of God in the forgiveness of sins. On Sept. 18, 1884, the Holy Ghost came to abide. During the twenty years of her widowhood she has verified the promise, "Thy Maker is thy husband," as Jesus Christ became the Bridegroom of her heart. She became interested in missions in early life, and at times this interest has been to her like "fire shut up in the hones." She is full of praise to God for the opportunity of entering the field, going forth with afaith in God. 1 Corinthians 15: 58.

Miss Gertrude Louise Perry was born Aug. 3, 1879, and converted at the age of thirteen. On Sept. 17, 1901, she was sanctified, and a month later the Holy Ghost came into her heart, and has remained ever since. She has always been interested in missionary work, and recently the desire to do such work has deepened. She feels sure that the Lord has led her about entering the mission field this fall. Trusting his promises and obeying his commands she feels confident of success. Joshua 1: 7, 8; Philippians 4: 19.

Mrs Nellie G. Barnes was born in Coventry, Vt., Oct. 26, 1846, and was converted at the age of 15, while at home. She was sanctified in Los Angeles, Cal., September, 1895, one morning after having given up all for Christ the night before. The longing for mission work has been on her heart for

years, and last September, when Brother and Sister Wood were collecting funds for a hospital in India, the old longing to go to India came back to her, and she decided that if the Lord opened the way she would go to India with them on their return. A favorite verse is the last clause of Matt. 28: 20.

Brother Leighton S. Tracy was born in Waterville, N. H., Aug. 14, 1882. When a boy eleven years old God put his hand upon him and said, "Son, give me thine heart." He immediately responded to this gracious call and was clearly converted. He was sanctified wholly Jan. 16, 1902. Had a call to special

work for the Lord in 1901, and a little later to the foreign field. In May, 1903, God pointed to India. In response to this call his heart cried out, "I delight to do thy will, Oh God." Brother Tracy goes from the Pentecostal Church in Haverhill, Mass.

Brother Elmer Burgess was born in Hudson, Mass., August 22, 1874. Was converted when about fifteen and sanctified about four years later. He feels that God has called him to India.
