





Years of Legacy

For many of us, college is a time of fresh starts and new beginnings. It is a time when we are anxious to learn about ourselves and make life-long friendships. It is our very first glimpse of the real world. Little did we know coming into such a major event that we were entering into something much bigger than the four years that we would spend here.

This year's theme, "110 Years of Legacy," is one that has been jumping out at me since the very start of my freshman year. Trevecca is a school grounded in purpose and history. The cool thing about a yearbook is that it is more than a collection of pictures that we get at the start of each year. It is documenting the mark that we have made on the school during that school year. And what a big year 2010-2011 was; so much happened on campus-from renovations to new programs. Five, ten, twenty years from now people will look back on

this year and remember the legacy that we left behind.

As I have tried to develop this idea of legacy, I wondered what the legacy of the Darda is. The first Darda was published in 1928 and its name is a biblical word that means "pearl of knowledge." The editor of the first Darda explained the choice of name: "not because it is a masterpiece . . . it is merely a tangible and material record of the lights and shadows of a year spent at Trevecca." That is exactly what I hope this year's Darda can be, a continuation of a legacy, a small glimpse of a chapter in a story that finds its story in a legacy that began far more than 110 years ago, actually more than 2,000 years

ago.



Prologue from the President



They are all dead. The people who started Trevecca in 1901 are all dead and gone. We remember their names when we review Trevecca's history, or when we make the homecoming trek to J. O. McClurkan's grave. A few people are still around who knew the people who knew Trevecca's founders, but most of that generation is also dead.

Yet, here Trevecca is–110 years later. Not many things have outlived Trevecca. It's older than most car models, clothing styles, songs, sports franchises, restaurant chains, and modes of transportation. It's old. And still here.

Trevecca is founded on a vision which has not changed significantly during the past century plus a decade. Trevecca is still a Christian community providing education for leadership and service. Its story is a fragile one. Had God wanted to take Trevecca out of its Depression-era misery, God had plenty chances to do so. Yet it survived for another day.

It's not fiction or sheer imagination that the hand of God has rested on Trevecca Nazarene University. Its influence is felt around the world. An old motto said it well: "The sun never sets on Trevecca Nazarene College."

It would be easy to list the significant accom-Prologue plishments of the past decades as evidence that Trevecca is as strong as ever. But we in the Trevecca "family" have never been a "too-proud" people, always tending to underestimate our strength while relying on God. May we always remember that our stability and strength are not rooted in our own doing, but in the activity of God. As long as we are doing God's work in the world, we will have a reason to exist.

Trevecca's story and the aspirations of its alumni are best told in the Trevecca Hymn. I still sing it with gratitude to God. I hope as you browse this yearbook, you will hear the glad refrain.

• In early 2011 the new Alumni Center was completed, giving the campus a new welcome center for guests and providing new office space.

• The Adams Administration Building was renovated, resulting in new offices for the Offices of Graduate Psychology and Academic Affairs and new classroom spaces for Graduate Psychology.

• The lecture hall in Greathouse Science Building was reconfigured with new desks and laptop connections.

• Tidwell Faculty Center received new paint and carpet, new furnishings, and updated electrical work.

• Apple Dining Room in the Jernigan Student Center was reconfigured: smaller tables, booths, a new composting system for refuse, a rotisserie oven, a "Subway-style" sandwich bar, and additional outside seating and heaters.

• The bathrooms in Benson Hall were completely redone, outdoor ramps were resurfaced and given new railings, new outdoor lighting was added, and the sidewalk was replaced.

• Windows in Georgia, Tennessee, and Johnson Halls were replaced with windows which matched those in newer campus buildings.

• The Trevecca Print Shop moved to 80 Nance Lane; its former facility was renovated for use by the External Relations marketing team.


•A new fence and storm drainage system was added to the baseball field, and the walking track was repaved.



Life Calling and Purpose

Third time's a charm!

Making the LEAP from high school to college can be a daunting task, but freshmen have a Life Calling and Purpose class (LEAP) to help make the transition easier. In the third year of this program, LEAP groups of freshmen are led by a peer mentor and a group leader, and the LEAP sessions help freshmen find their places in this world, how to prioritize their time and energy, how to avoid overextending themselves, and how to look beyond the surface of who they are.

"I like the fact that you get placed with people that you wouldn't normally hang out with; being placed this way causes you to form relationships with them and have a better variety of friends" said Brittany Smith.

This year the LEAP Program offered a new pilot course called the Adventure Group, composed of students selected by the admission counselors. Tom Middendorf was in charge of this project and was pleased. "The first year has gone well! We are tentatively looking at launching a total of three of these Adventure groups for next year. There are a lot of logistics that go into making this a safe and successful experience." said Tom. These students studied what it means to be a leader. They went on a three-day backpacking trip to Savage Gulf, learning more about their strengths and weaknesses, and also how to work together as a team.




Homecoming

Trojan Idol




Welcome Back



Approximately 500 attended, and the students' response was nothing but positive. There is much anticipation for Boonearoo 2!















Youth In Mission








Jotham Miller spent his summer in China doing medical missions. Sadie Wood spent her summer in Africa doing friendship evangelism.



A condition of their being in China was that they would not talk openly about others with their faith, so these five took classes in Mandarin to build relationship with Chinese students in the community and operated a weekend clinic in the area where the devastating earthquake took place in April 2010. Jotham says that his experience was incredible: "It was amazing because I was able to do something I'm so passionate about; I was able to do basic vitals such as blook





pressure, pulse, height, weight, and body mass index for 100 people."

In Liberia, Devon Eby and Sadie Wood held twenty vacation Bible school programs, participated in showings of the Jesus film, and helped with the Church of the Nazarene's GOL 2010 evangelism effort which uses soccer as a way to connect with young people. They say that the relationships they made there made such an impact on them. Sadie reflected, "I think about Liberia probably during every meal I have. Meals bring up really hilarious moments that we had—trying spicy and questionable foods and learning how to cook with coal. On the contrary, sometimes having meals makes me think about how I have friends in Liberia who are suffering pretty badly. One of my favorite authors, Shauna Niequist, says that once you see something, you can't un-see it. What happened this summer will never leave me."

Summer TAG

Trevecca is always looking for ways to expand its horizons. Trevecca Around the Globe, or TAG, has many different trips for students to participate in, and those in charge are always searching for places where students can be sent.

This past summer two teams of Trevecca students were sent to South America, one to Peru and one to Nicaragua. The team in Peru filled every second of their time there evangelizing and exploring the beautiful country. They held a soccer tournament with twenty teams competing, and TAG members shared their testimonies. They helped with a women's conference, where sixty women accepted Christ. They visited a women's jail and planted trees in a Nazarene community that Trevecca has adopted. The group planned a children's festival which was held during showing of the Jesus film. One night more than 10,000 people attended the showing and more than 5,000 asked Christ into their lives. A celebration service was held that Sunday to thank God for all that had He had blessed them with.

The Nicaragua team spent a majority of their time at an elementary school in El Almendro. They met the district superintendent of the Church of the Nazarene in that area; he is planting a Church of the Nazarene. They also met the missionary to Costa Rica, Nicaragua, and Panama. At the elementary school, they worked on the roof and installed a water line, so the students could have running water. They also held a few VBS programs and showings of the Jesus film.

Emily Eaton, part of the Nicaragua team, summed up her experiences: "What impressed me the most is the generosity and kindness of the Nicaraguan people. Orlando Cisneros, the district superintendent, and his family were "buena gente" (Spanish for "wonderful people"), and they were so loving, giving and kind. The children were amazing as well; they loved to be around us and talk to us, which was a little difficult at times with the language barrier, but nonetheless super rewarding."







Spring TAG

Each year members of the Trevecca community participate in mission trips locally and globally through the Trevecca Around the Globe (TAG) Program. This year there were four trips. The fall break trip, October 8-12, took participants to the John M. Perkins Foundation for Reconciliation and Development in Jackson, Mississippi. This team ministered to families through home repairs, urban gardening, and landscaping. They listened to a founder of the Christian Community Development Movement and dialogued about reconciliation, social justice, and issues facing America's cities.

Participants on the spring break trip, March 5-13, worked at the Dr. Paul Gamertsfelder Mission Centre in Frome, Jamaica. This team assisted in the construction of a multifunctional clinic which will provide health care for impoverished families. They also participated in creative outreach and beach ministry to and with Jamaicans of all ages.

The team on the summer break trip, May 8-23, ministered at the Michael Job Center for Orphaned Girls in Coimbatore, India. They served more than five hundred orphaned girls (daughters of martyred and persecuted Christians from all over Asia) through VBS and relational ministry. The team also traveled to other ministry centers in Southern India and served in a variety of ways.


A second summer break team went Arequipa, Peru, May 11-25. This team worked with Extreme Nazarene Ministries to help missionaries plant churches in communities where the gospel is absent or underserved. They accomplished this work through daily compassionate outreach and discipleship.

Learning about social justice abroad : Eastern Europe













It isn't very often that students get to take the difficult lessons they learn in class and apply that learning in the real world; however, in the summer of 2010 a group of students, led by professors Tim Green and Kathy Mowry, were able to travel to one of the oldest part of the world and learn about its history in relation to their faith and their calling.

The Eastern European trip was specifically offered to students in the social justice department at Trevecca, but participation was open to all students. The group met with the Sunbergs, a missionary family stationed in Eastern Europe. Then the group traveled through Romania and Bulgaria, learning about the social injustices that people living there face daily. They saw children who live in the streets of Bulgaria because of poverty. They visited a village where the local pastor visits the homes of families with daughters and talks to the parents about the advantages of not selling their girls.

These experiences had such an impact on the students and teachers that they returned home to form mission teams which will live in different areas of Romania, Bulgaria, and Albania in the summer of 2011. Their positive response to the difficult lessons that they learned on their mission trip illustrates the way that members of the Trevecca community confront the harsh realities of the world—by doing everything they can to work against the suffering.





















Croatia

For several years many Trevecca students have participated in mission trips through Trevecca Around the Globe (TAG) and Youth in Mission. In 2010 Trevecca students began a new kind of mission experience through Submerge, a mission program that enables students to become so interwoven with their new communities that they are inseparable from those around them.

Trevecca partnered with 365m, a master's program at Nazarene Theological Seminary, to send a team of five Trevecca alumni to Zagreb, Croatia: Michael Hendricks, Jerry Romasco, Brittany Argabright, Hope Brock, and Emily Humble. They were informed of the opportunity in 2009, when most were preparing to graduate and figuring out what to do with their futures. After deciding to serve a year in Croatia, their major obstacle was raising the \$100,000 needed for their support during the coming year. The Trevecca community, friends, and family rallied, and the funding was collected. They left their home on September 1 and arrived without any complications. They will return home in August 2011.

A new, smaller team will take their places. Stephanie Sherwood and Ben Ponder have decided to take the leap and will leave for Croatia in October of 2011. They have been in contact with the current team and feel secure about leading the Croatia effort. Even though there are only two of them, they are very excited about what God has in store for them, and they feel reassured because their predecessors have paved the way for them. Stephanie stated, "In short, I am beyond excited to see what God has in store for me, and I look forward to meeting new people, learning new things, and growing deeper in my relationship God."





Campus Ministries




Women's Basketball



Baseball

During the 2011 season Trevecca's baseball team battled to a second place finish in the TranSouth Athletic Conference, finishing 18-6 in conference play, 35-22 overall, and 19-11 against ranked teams. Trevecca opened the season with a 6-1 record. Four of those wins were against teams receiving votes for the NAIA Top 25. As conference play began, Trevecca took two of three at defending NAIA-champion Cumberland University. Trevecca was the only team to win a series against Cumberland, who won the conference, and third-place Union. Both of those series were on the road.

Trevecca pitchers Craig Stem and PJ Francescon were drafted in the 2011 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. It was the first time two Trojans were drafted in the same MLB Draft. The team won numerous awards. Jackson Nichols and Caleb Longshore earned a place on the 2011 Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athlete List. Jordan Foreman was selected to the 2011 TranSouth Rawlings Gold Glove Team. Head Coach Jonathan Burton was named the 2011 Transouth Coach of the Year. Six Trojans—Mitch McClay, Chad Reynolds, Jordan Foreman, Matt Tidwell, Dylan Kuhn, and Craig Steam were selected to the 2011 All-TranSouth Team. All but Stem were on the first team.




For the first time in almost 40 years, Trevecca offered its students the opportunity to participate in cross-country track. The program was canceled in 1978, but work began in late 2009 to bring back the program so that Trevecca could offer more opportunities for students.

The University began by tapping Dean Cole to lead both men's and women's cross country. Cole, who had been coaching cross-country for ten years, began recruiting runners for the team. The track around the baseball field was

repayed for the team, and when the new school year started, training began.

The men's team had its first meet on September 3 at Percy Warner Park. The men focused on building team unity and improving their time. By their third meet, each runner had improved his time significantly. The team competed in the TranSouth Championship race and came in fifth. Mark Hewitt and Frank Wheeler were named Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes. In October, Mark Mitchel was named runner of the week. Also in October, the TranSouth Conference held a banquet in honor of its scholar-athletes, and three Trojans were credited for their academic exce lence—Mark Hewitt, Frank Wheeler, and Alex Hodge. Though the team will lose a few seniors, the runners look forward to the future of cross country at Trevecca.
