The world and those who dwell therein (Psalms 21:1)


Knowing that the earth belongs to God is all we need to know to understand that we need to be good stewards of the earth. Being good stewards means being environmentally careful.

Trevecca students have reached the conclusion that members of the Trevecca community are called to be good neighbors in the world and to take care of our little plot of turf in a way

It also means that we restore our old campus buildings that are energy hogs and high-cost utility consumers. To this end, Trevecca has renovated the Adams Building, the McClurkan Building, the Bud Robinson Building (Center for Leadership, Calling, and Service), replaced windows in all the women's dorms, renovated the bathrooms in the men's dorms, and restored the labs in the Greathouse Science Building. 


After graduating with a degree in chemistry from Eastern Nazarene College in 1961, Chris Farrell earned a PhD in chemical biochemistry from Ohio State University in 1971. Hours after his dissertation was approved, Farrell, his wife and their two toddlers moved to South Africa, where he worked in the lab at Ethel Lucas Memorial Hospital in Acornhoek, six hours outside of Johannesburg.

When they returned to the States, Farrell did research and development for a commercial lab in Boston for a year and a half. Then he settled into a job at a hospital lab in Steubenville, Ohio, near his wife's parents, where Farrell and his wife stayed for the next twenty years, raising their four children. Toward the end of his time in Ohio, he spent a few years as a bi-vocational pastor in a small Church of the Nazarene.

He came to Trevecca in 1995 as assistant professor of chemistry. During his years at Trevecca, he has taught in the Department of Science and Math, the PA Program, and the Social Justice Program. He recently added more creative ventures—the aquaponics tanks in which he grows tilapia and greens in the greenhouse year-round and starting community gardens in Chestnut Hill and some nearby public schools.

In addition to their four children, Farrell and his wife, Judy, six grandchildren who are a constant source of amusement and amazement. They celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary last fall.









He has a medical clinic in New Delhi with 300 employees; all of the medical services are free for the poor.









Summer TAG Trip: India

In the summer of 2011 a Trevecca team traveled to India in order to provide a week of VBS to more than 500 girls at the Michael Job Center for Orphan Girls in Coimbatore, India. P. P. Job, Center director, has adopted more than 800 girls and is rearing and educating them—girls who were rejected by their families who wanted sons. Each year parents in India kill many girls because girls are burdens to a family; families must provide a dowry to a daughter's future husband, but sons receive dowries and can provide security for aging parents. Thus, sons embody the hope of parents, and girls are thrown away like human trash. Dr. Job rescues these unwanted girls and gives them hope for their future. He has built a college for them, where they can earn a dual degree, one that is accepted in India and also in the United States.









The Trevecca team, composed of all females, was accompanied by professors Bryce Fox and Roy Philip and Fox's daughter Brielle, age 11. The team conducted VBS in the morning for half of the girls and an afternoon VBS for the other half. The days also included time for music, for teaching soccer, and for hanging out with the girls. This team is the first from Trevecca to visit India.

Chapel

Men's Soccer

The Trevecca men's soccer team played an impressive season, beginning with a promising start of 3-2-1 heading into the team's first conference match at Mid-Continent. After a series of wins, the men's team beat St. Catharine and Tennessee Temple (2-0 and 6-0 respectively) to make it to the NCCAA Mid-East Regional Semifinals against Oakland City University in Oakland City, Indiana; however, the men were not able to pull away with victory. In an earlier interview, Trevecca's head coach Danny Leavy commented, "I'm really proud of the guys; they worked hard and did what they had to do, which put us through to the NCCAA Regionals." Through hard teamwork and cooperation, the men were able to finish the season with an overall record of 9-9-1.



The men demonstrated true Trevecca spirit and cooperation this season as well in a fundraiser for an opposing team. Fans, students, and alumni collected and donated shoes of any kind for St. Catharine's mission trip to Costa Rica. The cooperation and teamwork of both teams was a powerful demonstration of true sportsmanship.

The NCCAA released its 2011 Mid-East Men's Soccer All-Region team with Trevecca placing three players on the 14-member squad: junior Jordan Enix; freshman Rodrigo Maciel; and freshman Sisco Maciel. Sophomore Jonathan Baskin was named to the 2011 Capital One Academic All-District Team, a recognition of the nation's top student-athletes. 




Women's Soccer



This year was the women's soccer best regular season in the history of the program—the first time a Trevecca women's soccer team finished with a winning record and the most wins in one season in the history of the program. Included in those wins were victories over sister Nazarene program at Mount Vernon and against the team's most intense rival, nearby Cumberland. Finishing the year with a thrilling 3-2 win on a sudden-death goal in overtime sent the team into the NCCAA Regional Tournament. With the win, the women qualified for the NCAA Regional Tournament on November 18 and 19. This year's leading scorer was freshman Brooke Gann with seven goals, followed by junior Lindsey Robinson with six.

The team participated in some significant community outreach projects. Each Saturday, the team went to the Donelson YMCA to play soccer with their "buddies," special-needs children enrolled in a new soccer league called Full-Circle Soccer. Each of the twenty kids was paired with a Trevecca female player; the pairs held hands and played together, and the Trevecca players encouraged and showed them where to go and what to do. "It's been a great thing for both us and them," says head coach Brett Armstrong. "Several of the "buddies" came to our game with Lyon, and we honored them at halftime by having them come onto the field to receive medals and special recognition." The team also ran a soccer clinic for some local kids from the Youth Life Learning Center, a faith-based afterschool program for lower-income kids and their families. The team has also hosted several local teams of elementary-age girls who come to games to help as ball girls. Afterwards the Trevecca players enjoy spend time with them, hanging out and signing autographs. "We have a really close-knit group of girls who enjoy being together, and I think that unity is reflected in how they play on the field," concluded Coach Armstrong.








The team, however, had to overcome several challenges before even starting the season and was able to finish with an overall record of 10-18. The roster started with fourteen players. By October the numbers had dropped to nine, and by the start of the first game seven girls were left. An addition at mid-term raised the team number back up to eight players, but shortly thereafter a broken arm put the roster back at seven again. "And that's how we finished our season," commented Coach Van Atta. "I was really proud of our players and the way they handled adversity. I have coached a long time, and I have never had a team face this much adversity in one season."

Within the season, the women's team faced a schedule with four teams ranked in the top ten in the country and seven additional teams that made it to the NAIA National Tournament. However, even with number against them, the girls were able to beat two ranked teams and three games that went into overtime and played in eleven games in which the outcomes could only be decided after the last minute of the game.

In this season alone, the Trojan women demonstrated tremendous strength, courage, and determination through teamwork and survival against the odds. "Our team Bible verses were about faith-faith in God, faith in [self], and faith in each other (Matt 17:20, Ecc 4:9-10). "Our team survived by its strong faith," said Van Atta. "Our coaching staff loves the attitude and the determination of the players on this team!"

Trevecca's Gospel Choir also performs throughout the year. The music of this group is Christian-contemporary, worship songs, spirituals, and gospel songs.





Godspell

Jeff Frame shared with us his view on the exciting fall musical Godspell, "According to Stephen Schwartz, Act One is about Jesus building a community of love among his disciples. In Act Two, Jesus is teaching his disciples to continue in this community of love and to take personal responsibility for Jesus' "good news" after He is token away from them. As a Christian, I like to take Schwartz's prompts and run with them. I think the beautiful message of Godspell is found in the lyrics of Jesus during the song "God Save the People" when Jesus, played by T.J. Adams sings, "Man's clouded sun shall brightly rise, and songs be heard instead of sighs. God sove the people." The character of Jesus spends most of the musical trying to teach the "song" of the Gospel to His followers via parables, revelotions, and games. The response of the disciples in "On the Willows" at the end of the musical is one of confusion, "But how can we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land?" This is the key question the musical asks regarding each of us. The message of Godspell is the good news of Jesus Christ and our response of learning to sing the "song of Jesus" in a foreign land, a land that's filled with sighs."








in the Park


Spring 2012 Drama


