


# JUNIORS

LIKE THE PAGES of medieval times, we sophomores of 1950 have striven to be worthy of our Lord, that some day we may become true knights.


This year we were ever eager to acquire skill in scholastic pursuits.



# FRESHMEN




The tone of our Friday night prayer meetings has been encouraging and inspiring as a volume of praise has arisen from consecrated hearts.
